

Food in Context

June 1 - 15: Bangalore, Coorg mountains

Rural Public Health

June 8 - 22: Bangalore, Mysore, Nagpur, & Pune

Rural medical practitioners make up 80% of outpatient care in India and this program will not only introduce you to outstanding organizations in rural and tribal health services, but also institutions devoted to education, special needs, women's health, and the mid-day meal programs.

Social Entrepreneurship

June 15 - 29: Chennai, Puducherry and Madurai

Delegates will explore social enterprises that have developed exceptional models of success at scale in the fields of special education, micro-finance, healthcare, research, and cultural studies.

June 29 - July 13: Hyderabad & Cochin

The tour will combine art, architecture, housing, landscape and sustainability. Explore the award-winning eco-architecture firm, research institutes, and performing artists that are transforming India's cities.
